THE POWER OF A SIMPLE GIFT

Our shoebox gifts for Operation Christmas Child have started on their way to children around the world who are suffering from poverty, disasters, disease, war, and persecution. The boxes go to more than 130 countries. As the boxes are handed out, the recipients are offered a colorful storybook, The Greatest Gift of All, which tells the real meaning of Christmas, and is available in over 70 languages. Operation Christmas Child partners with local churches worldwide to offer many of the children a Bible study course, The Greatest Journey.

This year we sent 89 boxes, and some additional monetary donations. The total includes 11 boxes put together by the elementary Sunday school class using items that have been contributed. We enjoy organizing these boxes and we thank those who contributed to our effort.

Please pray for the children around the world who will receive these boxes, and for their families. Also, pray for all those involved in processing, transporting, and delivering the gifts, and that doors will be opened in countries that are not receptive to the Gospel.



SESSION

The Session met on Monday, November 13, 2017 and took the following actions:

- * Reviewed and accepted the Financial Report through October 31, 2017.
- * Examined and Approved Beverly Brown as a Deacon.
- * Examined and Approved Bruce Emery as an Elder. They will be Ordained and Installed Sunday, November 19, 2017 during the second service.
- * One of the responsibilities of an interim pastor is to update the church's membership rolls. Session Approved adding an "Inactive Membership" Category to the church's rolls. Letters were sent and/or calls were made to several members who have not attended services for at least one year asking what they wished to do about their membership. Depending on their response or lack of response they remained on the Active roll, moved to the Inactive roll or they cancelled their membership. We will not pay the Presbytery "Per Capita" for those on the Inactive roll or whose membership was cancelled beginning in 2019.
- Approved changing the Office hours to 9am-4pm.
- * Approved discontinuing the church's Friday listing in the Peninsula Daily News as people use other tools for finding a church and charges for this have doubled over the past 6 months.
- Approved continuing the listing in the PDN Holiday Guide and the Visitors' Guide.
- Approved closing procedures for the building following Sunday services.
- * Approved the Mission Committee's request to distribute the \$5,000 tithe from the Gretchen Crow and Bobby Ewing estates to the following organizations: Half to World Ministries through the Outreach Foundation. The second half will go to local ministries (Young Life, The Answer for Youth (TAFY) and MANNA).
- * Approved increasing the pay for Pulpit Supply from \$150 to \$200.
- * Approved changing the Session meetings to the third Monday of each month. The next meeting will be on December 18 at 7 PM.

ANNA'S HIGHLIGHTS EPISTLE FOR DECEMBER

2017 CHRISTMAS BASKETS



Once again it's time to prepare our congregation's annual Christmas Baskets (boxes). The boxes go to members of our church family or families in our community that members know who are having a difficult time. Family names with addresses, phone numbers, and the number of adults and children and their ages should be submitted to the church office by 4 PM Friday, December 8. We also ask the principals of the local grade schools

to submit names of three students and their families who are struggling. We prepare boxes (from 3 to 6 per family based on family size) for up to 25 families. Family names remain confidential until the boxes are delivered on Saturday morning, December 16, 2017.

Donated food and other items should be at the church by noon Monday, December 11 when we will inventory donations and begin assembling the boxes. Turkeys and turkey breast donations can be placed in the kitchen freezer.

Donations of money are also gratefully received. Write "Christmas Baskets" in the memo line of your check. The money is used to purchase additional items that are needed.

We need and welcome your help assembling the boxes beginning Tuesday, December 12. The schedule for assembling the boxes is:

Tuesday, December 12, 2 to 4 - Organize and label boxes with family codes Wednesday, December 13, 10 to 12 - Begin filling boxes

3:30 to 6 - Continue filling boxes

Thursday, December 14, 2:30 to 5 - Finish filling boxes, move boxes from basement to the Fellowship Hall

Friday, December 15, 1 to 3 – Add fresh food (except turkeys and perishables) Saturday, December 16, 9 to 11 – Add turkeys and perishables.

The other fifty percent supports Presbyterian-related schools and colleges provide education and leadership development while nurturing racial and ethnic heritage. CPR TRAINING OFFERED AT THE CHURCH



Did you ever wonder what the white cabinet in the Fellowship Hall labeled "AED" held inside? It is a nearly automatic device that can save a life—possibly someone you know. It does NO

good unless there a number of people in the Church trained in the basics of how to use it.

We will have a course taught by the Port Angeles Fire Dept. Paramedics in use of CPR and emergency care at the **Church on Saturday**, **Jan 13**, **2018 at 9 AM** (lasts less than 4 hours). You will have an opportunity to be certified (or recertified) in "CPR (adult, child, and infant), use of the defibrillator (AED), and treating conscious and unconscious choking" for a 2 year period. Course fees will be paid by the Church. These skills are not difficult, but they can save a life here at the Church or elsewhere at the grocery store or mall. FINANCIAL PEACE UNIVERSITY IS COMING IN JANUARY

STEP UP TO STEWARDSHIP

How generous are you? How old are you? Studies indicate that how we give is linked to our generation. Nationwide, the average giving to churches is 3 to 4% of churchgoers' income; 90% of churchgoers do not tithe.

Barna Group is a private, non-partisan organization that has been conducting and analyzing primary research to understand cultural trends related to values, beliefs, attitudes, and behaviors for more than 30 years. In 2016, Barna published The Generosity Gap report that focuses on "Generations & Generosity: How Age Affects Giving."

Four generations were identified along with rough estimates of dates:

Elder generation – born prior to 1945 Boomers – born 1946 to 1964 Gen-X – born 1965 to 1984 Millennials – born 1982 to 2004

The generations differ significantly in defining what generosity is, in the importance of generosity to them, in how generous with money they are, and in the ultimate financial goal for their lives.

There were ten financial goals to rate by importance for each generational respondent:

Be content
Be debt-free
Establish a financial legacy
Give charitably
Meet my obligations and needs
Provide for my family
Serve God with my money
Show my talent/hard work
Support the lifestyle I want
Other

Stewardship continued....

The first and second goals for all Christians surveyed were to provide for my family and to support the lifestyle I want.

Those were also the first and second priorities for the Millennials, Gen-Xers, and Boomers, although the last group gave equal weight to **give charitably** as second priority.

The first and second priorities for the Elders were to serve God with my money and to give charitably.

To serve God with my money ranked 6^{th} for all Christians as well as for Gen-Xers and Boomers. It ranked 4^{th} for Millennials and 1^{st} for Elders.

What you need:


- Construction paper (two pieces, including one white)
- · Pencil
- Scissors
- Pens
- Glue stick



What you do:

- Neatly fold the white paper in half, short side to short side.
- 2. Draw two parallel lines (at least 2 inches apart) from the fold to about halfway to the edge. Cut along the lines.
- 3. Fold the cut section back and forth so it pops up.
- Push the section up so it pops up inside the folded paper. Draw a nativity scene on the pop-up box.
- Fold the colored paper in half, short side to short side. Place the white paper inside it and glue the white paper down, being careful not to glue the pop-up box.
- Write a Christmas message and give or send the card to someone.
